2018 Airline Passenger Traffic Shatters Records at Palm Springs International Airport

Jan. 17, 2019

Passenger traffic at Palm Springs International Airport continues to shatter records.

Airline data on total passengers in 2018 set an all-time record with a total **2,327,018** visitors flying in and out of the Airport, shattering 2017's record of 2,100,072, preceded by 1,998,206 record passengers in 2016.

“With a 10.8 percent increase year over year, passenger traffic at PSP continues to set records,” said City Manager David H.
