

# Wednesday, September 5, 2018 Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the City Council

City Attorney Kotkin reported that the City Council received briefings and provided direction to staff regarding the agendized Closed Session items, but did not take any reportable action; noted that certain items listed on the Closed Session Agenda were not discussed due to time constraints; announced that Mayor Moon recused himself and left the Closed Session during discussion of City of Palm Springs v. Leonard M. Lewis et al.

## **PUBLIC TESTIMONY**

Steven Price, Palm Springs Preservation Foundation Board Member, speaking on Item 3B, expressed support for the moratorium on demolition of historic structures.

<u>Dick Burkett</u>, speaking on Item 3B, voiced support for the enactment of the urgency ordinance preventing the demolition of historic structures; noted that numerous Class 3 historic properties have been lost due to demolition; noted that the Historic Site Preservation Board will develop a comprehensive list of recommendations for the City Council's consideration.

<u>Daryl Terrell</u>, speaking on Item 5A, spoke on the importance of maintaining local control and supporting the League of California Cities; recommended that the City Council develop a Legislative Platform.

<u>Barbara Betty</u>, speaking on Item 1K, pointed out that the District Attorney has refused to investigate the allegations related to the Mayor and a surveillance camera; questioned whether the investigation will produce any actionable results; opined that taxpayer dollars could be better utilized for the community.

Robin Abrahams, Speaking on Item 5A, voiced concern related to bicycle and pedestrian safety due to the Indian Canyon Drive two-way conversion not including dedicated bicycle lanes; opined that bicycle lanes would encourage more non-motorized transportation in the Downtown.

<u>Judy Deertrack</u>, Speaking on Item 1K, asserted that the City Council is attempting to attack the Mayor regarding the mistake of installing a surveillance camera; opined that the Mayor did not have intent to harm anyone and questioned the purpose of an investigation.

<u>Joy Brown Meredith</u>, Spoke regarding Item 1I and 4A, noted that the City will have a new tree trimming contract and the new contractor will soon address the palm trees which need trimming; voiced support for the Indian Canyon two-way conversion, noting that no parking spots will be eliminated as a result of the project.

# CITY COUNCIL, SUBCOMMITTEE, AND CITY MANAGER'S COMMENTS AND REPORTS

Mayor Pro Tem Roberts reported on the Council Chamber renovation, expressing gratitude to Information Technology Director Brown for leading the construction project.

Councilmember Middleton commended Mayor Pro Tem Roberts and staff for their work in designing and completing the Council Chamber renovation; reported on the various community engagement meetings to inform the community about the districting process; noted that the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) Community Working Group will present its recommendations to the City Council at a study session on September 27, 2018.

Mayor Moon noted that the Palm Springs Chamber of Commerce will host the State of City on September 6, 2018, noting that residents may attend for free or watch live online or on PSTV; spoke on the success of the Council Chamber renovation.

Councilmember Holstege noted that the pace of work is rapid and that the Council Meeting recess during August allow staff to address the workload; advised that the Sustainability Commission has a working group exploring a disposable plastic straw ordinance; spoke on the success of the backpack giveaway at the James O. Jessie Unity Center and the Stuff the Bearcat event to support the Well in the Desert.

David Freedman summarized his methods for determining an appropriate law firm to conduct the investigation. In response to City Council inquiry, Mr. Freedman reported on the qualifications of Meyers Nave Riback Silver & Wilson related to municipal investigations and agreed to provide oversight related to the attorney's billing.

Councilmember Holstege noted that the investigation may help protect the City against an employment lawsuit and protect against liability.

Mayor Pro Tem Roberts voiced support for the project, noting that the greenbelts will make a livable space for residents.

Councilmember Holstege recommended that the City consider biodiversity and the planting of a variety of crops in future development projects.

Planning Director Fagg presented the staff report and responded to City Council inquiries.

Mayor Moon noted that it is not the City's intent to preserve every home constructed prior to 1969, pointing out that older homes should be reviewed by the Historic Site Preservation Board prior to demolition or major alterations to ensure that the home does not have significant historic value.

Councilmember Middleton agreed that property owners should be allowed to rehabilitate or reconstruct a residence which was poorly constructed or maintained.

In response to Council inquiries, Director Fagg advised that the City Attorney will make a final determination if a home should be allowed to be demolished or have major alterations due to health or safety concerns while a final ordinance is being crafted; advised that the Historic Site Preservation Board will review the proposed ordinance and that staff will return to City Council in October 2018.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER KORS, SECOND BY MAYOR PRO TEM ROBERTS, CARRIED 5-0, to adopt Ordinance No. 1963 entitled "AN INTERIM URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PALM SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON DEMOLITION OR SUBSTANTIAL ALTERATION OF STRUCTURES BUILT BEFORE 1969 (CLASS 3 HISTORIC STRUCTURES) TO ALLOW FOR CONSIDERATION OF APPROPRIATE AMENDMENTS TO THE GENERAL PLAN OR MUNICIPAL CODE IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTIONS 65858." Mayor Pro Tem Roberts noted that there are alternate bicycle paths into Downtown which are safer than a Class 2 bicycle lane on Indian Canyon Way; expressed support for the City to identify funding for landscape improvements along Indian Canyon Way in the future.

Mayor Moon commended Assistant City Manager and staff for obtaining two grants from the Coachella Valley Association of Governments to help fund the project.

Councilmember Holstege and Mayor Pro Tem Roberts agreed to serve on an Ad Hoc Subcommittee to provide design assistance for the rainbow crosswalks on Arenas Road. Councilmember Kors requested that the Subcommittee communicate with the newly formed Arenas Business Association regarding the rainbow crosswalks.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER KORS, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER MIDDLETON, CARRIED 5-0, to:

- Ratify the City Manager's approval of a construction contract to Electror Belco Electric, Inc., a California corporation, in the amount of \$4,464,857 for the Indian Canyon Drive Two-Way Conversion and Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Enhancements, CP 17-08. A7204.
- 2. Authorize the City Manager to approve and execute construction contract change orders up to a cumulative amount of \$446,485 (10% of the construction contract).
- 3. Authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary documents.

# **PUBLIC COMMENT**

William Tracy spoke on the incident in which a man attacked pedestrians in the Downtown area with pepper spray; questioned whether the Police Department followed proper protocols in responding to the incident.

<u>Brad Anderson</u> voiced concern that the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District is not taking necessary steps to prevent the spread of aedes aegypti mosquitos.

<u>Les Young</u> invited the community to attend the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual National Night Out event hosted by the Palm Springs Police Department; spoke on the success of the Stuff the Bearcat event, noting that residents and visitors provided donations.

# CITY COUNCIL AND CITY MANAGER REQUESTS AND UPCOMING AGENDA DEVELOPMENT

Police Chief Reyes advised that the pepper spray incident was actually bear repellant and it was an attempted robbery which occurred on August 9, 2018; noted that Police Officers immediately responded to the scene and apprehended the suspect and that the District Attorney will pursue all changes submitted by the Police Department.

Councilmember Middleton requested that staff begin exploring model programs and ordinances related to bicycle and scooter sharing.

Councilmember Holstege and Councilmember Middleton agreed to serve on an Ad Hoc Subcommittee related to Bicycle and Scooter Sharing Programs.

Councilmember Holstege requested that the City Council agendize consideration of declaring a shelter emergency at the City Council meeting of September 20, 2018.
