MEETING DATE: January 18, 2022

The Bicycle group consisting of Commissioner Torrens, Jim Flanagan, Brett Klein, Vic Yepello, Robin Abrahams and Timothy Papandreou have asked city staff to distribute an electronic bicycle survey.

The group began their efforts with a survey for the Oahu Bike Plan Update and made modifications to the survey to make it applicable to Palm Springs. The survey consisted of 35 questions.

During the December 21, 2021 Sustainability Commission meeting, Commissioner Torrens provided an update that the survey had received minor edits. City staff recommended the survey be condensed before distribution to the community. Commissioner Ocañas volunteered to review and edit the survey as surveying is a feature of her profession. Program Coordinator Sheldon will forward the draft survey to Commissioner Ocañas after the meeting. Commissioner Ocañas condensed the survey to 14 questions.

The condensed survey was forwarded to the bicycle group on January 4, 2022 and the feedback has been in support of the condensed survey but to add in question #23 about priorities.
