acquisition of the former Naval Hospital at Norco California, and to establish same as a Veterans' Home similar to the California Veterans' Home at Yountville.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council has noted that the former Naval Hospital has remained vacant for many months and is a site where considerable good could be accomplished for veterans of the wars, and particularly for those residing in Southern California.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is respectfully requested to urge the State Legislature to appropriate the moneys necessary to finance such an operation.

RESOLUTION NO. 6781

OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING AND URGING AID FROM THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS AND THE ASSOCIATION OF CONSERVATORS AND GUARDIANS

WHEREAS, there exists on Section Fourteen (14), Township FourSouth, Range Four East, San Bernardino Base & Meridian, innumerable piles of lumber, tar paper, and the like, resulting from demolition of substandard dwellings; and

WHEREAS, requests have been made to the City Council to permit burning of these piles of trash; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, with the aid of tha plat of the Building Inspector, has ascertained that much of the burning might readily endanger other existing dwellings, power lines, trees and the like; and

WHEREAS, it is the observation of the City Council that the most satisfactory method for eliminating this health hazard would be to remove the materials referred to for burning at the County Dump,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council does respectfully request and urge the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the newly organized Association of Conservators and Guardians to cooperate with the City of Palm Springs in formulating a program whereby such materials would be removed from Section Fourteen, with a minimum of expense to the taxpayers in light of the fact that improvement would result to lands which are not yielding taxation.
