WHEREAS, the City Council found from all evidence submitted that the said street described in the resolution of intention was and is unnecessary for present or prospective public street purposes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Palm Springs shall and it hereby does order the vacation and closing up of Balboa Road shown on the map of the Colony Tract on file in Book 19, Page 6 of Maps and Records of Riverside County, State of California, described as follows:

Balboa Road situated between and bounded by Santa Clara Way on the north, San Marco Way on the South, Lot 14 on the East and Lots 15 and 16 on the West.

RESOLUTION NO. 3172

RE HOUSING PROBLEM FOR LOCAL COLORED PEOPLE

WHEREAS, Councilman Nathanson has reported that the problem of housing local colored people has been under consideration by various local groups; and

WHEREAS, said Councilman Nathanson is now suggesting that, since Lienau Village public housing is presently occupied to but one-third capacity and will be vacated shortly by the present occupants, who will be transferred to the public housing on North Calle Encilia in Section 14 (Indian Land), which would leave Lienau Village available as temporary occupancy for the colored people now residing on Section 14 (Indian Land), many of whom have received eviction notices which will require them to abandon their present places of abode and leave them with no alternative; and has further recommended that in any event the Council, the City Manager and the City Attorney should consider the matter of relief for said colored people; and

WHEREAS, the Council is of the consensus that the matter should be

given every consideration;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to bring together all parties in interest in the situation hereinabove described in an effort to try to work out the problem of housing colored people at either Lienau Village or on North Calle Encilia Housing Installation above described.
