Vacation Rental and Homeshare Stakeholder Meeting Ordinance 2075 – Neighborhood Percentage Caps

- On November 22, 2022 City Council amended Chapter 5.25 – Vacation Rentals
- The ordinance establishes a cap of twenty percent (20%) of all residential dwelling units located within a particular Neighborhood
- Did not affect any existing certificates that were issued or applied to any completed applications received on October 17, 2022, or prior.
- If an application is received in a "capped" neighborhood, the application is returned, and the applicant is offered to apply to be on a waiting list.

Vacation Rental and Homeshare Stakeholder Meeting Ordinance 2075 – Junior Vacation Rental Certificate

- A new "Junior" Vacation Rental Registration Certificate is available for a reduced fee of \$642 in the City's Vacation Rental Program.
- The amount of Vacation Rental contracts per year allowed under this certificate is 6.
- Vacation Rental Percentage Caps do not apply to Junior Certificates.
- All other regulations of vacation rentals, including application requirements, operational requirements, TOT obligations, and penalties for violations apply

Vacation Rental and Homeshare Stakeholder Meeting Ordinance 2075 – Annual Allotted Contracts

- What changed?
 - All completed "new" applications received on October 18, 2022, and after:
 - 26 annual contracts

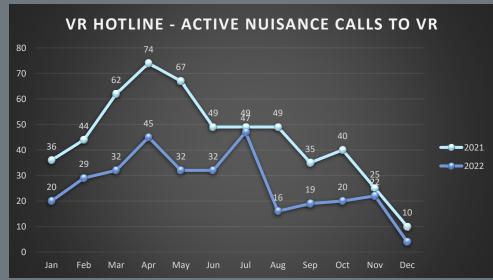
- What is changing?
 - All owners and agencies that have a certificate or submitted a completed application on or before October 17, 2022
 - 32+4 annual contracts
 - January 1, 2026, reduced to 26 annual contracts

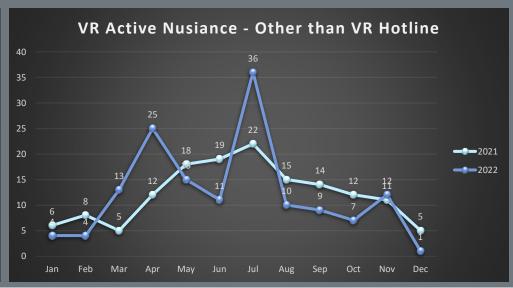


Vacation Rental and Homeshare Stakeholder Meeting 2022 Complaints

Complaints for 2022 vs 2021





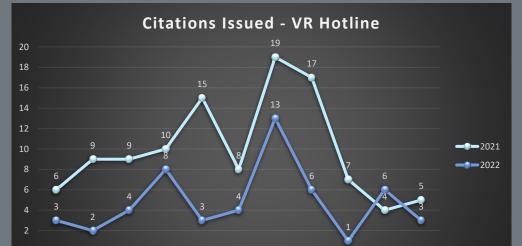




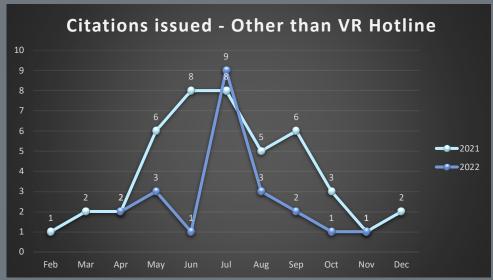
