• Roy Clark reviewed the 2021 Vulnerability Analysis: Impact and Adaptive Capacity are shown in a matrix to assess Vulnerability of natural systems, built systems, and human systems; results of the Vulnerability Analysis can be integrated into goals, policies, and implementation actions of the General Plan

The discussion will continue at the January Subcommittee meeting with focus on what involvement the Sustainability Commission will have, if any.
