• First comprehensive Zoning Code update since 1988.


Key Strategies:







General Fund Revenue




Property Tax Revenue

Property Tax (In Millions)




Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Revenue

TOT (In Millions)




Vacation Rental TOT Revenue



Vacation Rental TOT (In Millions)


Hotel TOT Revenue

Hotel TOT (In Millions)




Sales Tax Revenue



Supporting our Homeless

Operation Relentless Sun R.I.S.E. Homeless Outreach Initiative Operation Restore Hope PSPD IMPACT Team

- 65 unhoused reunited with family members
- 600+ vacant property checks
- 200 tons of trash removed
- 300 shopping carts collected
- 750 reports generated
- 900 arrests and criminal citations
- Multiple Crime Prevention Site Safety visits
- 280 camps cleaned and removed
 - Walmart 40 encampments;
 - Dinah Shore Flood Channel 12 encampments;
 - \circ Gene Autry Wash 70 encampments





Operation Rearview Mirror

Community Concern: Traffic Violations

Our Response: Created Operation Rearview Mirror to enhance Road Safety:

- Identified high-risk areas
- Targeted speeding and reckless driving
- Reduce Intoxicated Driving
- Awareness Campaign

Impact (First 3 Months):

- Collisions:
 - 34% decrease in total collisions.
 - 25% decrease in injury collisions.
- Enforcement Results:
 - Citations increased by 94%.
 - Warnings increased by over 300%.

BSCC Crime Grant

PSPD secured a \$4.6 million grant from the State to fight: Retail theft | Catalytic Converter Theft | Vehicle Theft

Palm Springs Regional Real-Time Information Center (RTIC): A Technology hub to use real-time data to strategically allocate resources


Key Technologies Include:

CCTV Cameras and a **Video Management System** for live monitoring.

Automated License Plate Readers (ALPRs) at both mobile and fixed locations.

Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) that can quickly respond to incidents.

Live911, which allows officers to hear 911 calls as they happen



With these advancements, RTIC will be a powerful tool for smarter, more efficient policing.



Bridges

Indian Canyon Bridge Project: Currently Underway

Widening the North Indian Canyon Bridge over the Union Pacific Railroad and improving Indian Canyon Drive immediately south of Garnet Avenue in North Palm Springs.

S. Palm Canyon Drive Bridge Project: Begins early 2025

Replacing S. Palm Canyon Drive bridge over Tahquitz Creek during an approximately two-year project to improve safety, traffic flow and mobility.

Ramon Road Bridge Project: Begins late 2025

Widen 4-lane bridge to 6-lane bridge, seismic retrofit as necessary, scour countermeasures.

Vista Chino Bridge Project: Begins mid 2027

Replace existing 4-lane roadway with a new 4-lane bridge. High-cost bridge project agreement required.





Bridge projects can take a long time to complete due to the multiple phases involved, including preliminary engineering, environmental review, and construction.

Costs have also increased significantly in recent years, with concrete prices going up by **as much as 75%** between 2021 and 2024.




Vision for the Future
